COWICHAN VALLEY FOREST MUSEUM

The forests of Vanceuver Island, British Columbia still ocho to the sound of the steam lecemetive at work, several of the major legging cempanies still use steam for powering their leg trains and one ex-legger has established an operating museum railrusd for public amusement. One mile north of Duncan, on the shores of beautiful Semenes Lake, the early history of Cowichan comes alive for the visiter in the Cowichan Valley Forest Museum. The museum is built around the extensive collection of old-time logger "Gorry" E. Wellburn. Welburn is no newice to steam legging, having served an apprenticeship with the C.P.R. as lecemetive fireman. Superintendent of a pair of sawuills and eventually starting his ewn small tie-millin the late twenties. A pieneer in the use of trucks in legging, he built this mill into a modern legging and sawmill operation which he later sold to H.R. MacMillan Export Company, his chief customer. He retained management of the Shawnigan Lake Legging Division until his retirement in 1962.

Welburn was astenished at the rate that legging lecies, both large and small, were being scrapped in favor of trucks which were able to go higher and deeper into the heart of B.C. 's forested hills. He therefore resolved to collect legging lecemetives as well as his sany other historical lumbering material and the basis for the suseum was established. The suseum is a co-operative enterprise of the nearby communities and industries.

The museum has nearly a mile of 3' narrow gauge tarck, laid upon retpreef yellow cedar ties and has an interesting lecemetice collection which includes shays, tank leces, and even gas lecemetives. An eutdeer exhibit of heavy mechines recalls the days of early legging and is accompanied by a late 1800 display of buggies and other herse drawn conveyances. A leg building is being erected to house the extensive Welburn collection of historic decuments and artifacts.
